Supply List for Junior High Students

General Supplies

Pencils, pens, ruler, scissors, glue stick and erasers
Pencil crayons (the larger the set the better)
Fine Felt markers (set of 12 colors)
Six packages of loose leaf paper and reinforcements
Book bag
Pencil case – Soft zippered bag please - no hard box or metal cases
1 (1”) Binder (or equivalent) to transport Homework back and forth to school

75 clear plastic sheet protectors (top-loading, heavy-weight) for L.A., Social and French. These are used to keep note handouts in good condition so they are available for exam study purposes. They are a life saver for many students who tend to lose things. (Note: Sheet protectors come in boxes of 150. DF brand is excellent quality.

Math

PENCILS ONLY

1 (2”) binder (zippered style recommended) and 8 dividers (Gr. 8) 9 dividers (Gr. 9)
1 mathematics (geometry) set (Please do not bring to school until requested.)
A good supply of HB pencils/erasures
1 scientific calculator – with fraction button
Package or Pad of Grid Paper
Sheet Protectors

Language Arts

1 (2”) Binder (Zipper Binder preferred)
14 loose-leaf dividers (Dividers can be saved and re-used in Gr. 8 & 9)
4 Hilroy Redi-Tab scribblers (3-hole punched, NO COILS)
2 Coil Scribblers:
 - 1 with 80 pages (Writer’s Workshop)
 - 1 with 140 pages (Response Journal 7, Teaching Journal 8 and 9)
1 Mini-Stapler
1 pack of fine multi-colored highlighters (4 different colors)
Red, blue and black pens for notes and marking
Whiteout tape (Absolutely no liquid whiteout)
Small Post-It Notes (1 2/3” X 1 7/8”) Package of 6.
1 Roget’s College Thesaurus: – These are available for purchase from the school at a cost of \$10.00.
1 English Dictionary - It is important that all students have a good dictionary at home. School dictionaries cannot go home. I would recommend the Gage Canadian. Computer dictionaries are not a good substitute.

Social Studies

1 (2”) binder (zipper preferred)
6 loose-leaf dividers
1 coil scribbler (for notes) 140 pages – **This scribbler needs to be purchased every year.**

Science

- 1 two inch binder (zipper preferred)
- 5 dividers and 5 duotangs
- Sheet Protectors

Art 7, 8 and 9

Because “representation” is part of the Language Arts and Social Studies curriculum, I will be doing Art projects from time to time through Language Arts and Social. Students are required to have the Art Supplies listed below.

- 1 9 x 12 (or a bit larger) Artist Sketchpad (Gr. 8s and 9s have one)
- 2 Black Felt –Pens (permanent ink) 1 Fine Tip & 1 Ultra Fine Tip Sanford – Sharpie Brand) – AVOID dual end pens
- One pair of Scissors –pointed for fine cutting
- Pencil crayons – set of 24 at least – do not need new ones
- 1 box of wax crayons – do not need new ones
- 2 white erasers [Factis Extra Soft or Staedtler Mars]
- Set of Drawing Pencils – (Sets range from 6-12 pencils. Try to have the range from 2H to 6B in the set you purchase. It does not matter how many pencils are in the set.
- 1 Aluminum Hand-Held Pencil Sharpener
- 1 (1”) binder for notes and handouts and 5 dividers
- 1 coil scribbler with 3 sections (100 pages) (Grade 8 and 9 students will continue to use the scribbler started in Grade 7)

Phys. Ed

- 1 pair of clean running shoes (that have non-marking soles) for indoors.
- 1 pair of running shoes for outdoors.
- shorts and T-shirt or sweat pants, and cool weather outdoor gym clothes
- Gym bag

Other Complementary Courses (Computers, Health, Drama, etc.)

- 4 duotangs
- Loose leaf paper
- 1 package of lined index cards

- 2 boxes of Kleenex for Homeroom Classrooms

Note: Students need to bring as many of their supplies as possible on the first day of school as the first few days of class are spent organizing lockers, labeling their materials, and organizing their binders. Students who do not have their supplies are at a disadvantage as there is a great deal to remember.
